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Unfortunately, news stories don't come with labels of fair or biased. But you can develop your own fairness meter by evaluating three key components to gauge how straight or slanted a story is.



Does the story simply present the facts or lead you to make judgments about them?

### Look for:

- · Loaded adjectives or verbs
- Patterns of very positive or negative descriptions

### CONTEXT

LOTS OF CONTEXT

Does the story provide the big picture or just a slice of what is going on?

### Look for:

- Historical comparisons
- Explanations about sources
- · Related facts or data

# COUNTERPOINTS

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Does the story help you understand multiple perspectives, or only one?

#### Look for:

- Counterarguments to key claims or conclusions
- Responses to accusations
